Publication of the final list of medical doctors autorised to participate at the elective extraordinary General Meeting of 9 December 2023

The Minister of Public Health, Dr MANAOUNDA Malachie, hereby informs Medical Doctors that, within the framework of the organisation of the extraordinary elective General Meeting of the Cameroon Medical Council scheduled on 9 December 2023 at the Yaounde Multipurpose Sports Complex, the final list of 2,883 Medical Doctors authorised to attend the said General Meeting, is annexed to this press release.

In order to ensure a hitchfree organisation, the Minister calls on all Medical Doctors authorised to attend the General Meeting to arrive the Yaounde Multipurpose Sports Complex on Saturday 9 December 2023, as from 6:30 a.m., for identification and registration formalities, bearing with them a valid identification document.

Moreover, in conformity with relevant provisions of the Code of Ethics, Medical Doctors who are unable to physically attend the General Meeting may be represented by their colleagues from the same **college** who will act on their behalf.

In this line, it should be recalled that a Medical Doctor may issue or receive **only one proxy « procuration » and a Medical Doctor who is a beneficiary of a proxy « procuration » cannot issue one to someone else.**

Hence, any Medical Doctor wishing to issue a proxy « procuration » is requested to provide the information below to the Working Group in charge of organising the elections, through telephone (**WhatsApp**) number **655 56 40 66 (A.G.E. ONMC)**, for the issuance of a secured and singular proxy form.

They are:

- Name, Surname and Registration Number on the roll of the Cameroon Medical Council, including the college of the authorising Medical Doctor;
- Scanned copy of the National Identity Card (Passport) of the authorising Medical Doctor.

Finally, the Minister of Public Health calls for a sense of responsibility and patriotism, for the commitment of all medical doctors to exhibit respect and courtesy, so as to ensure a more influential and resilient Medical Council, likely to further revalue the health profession./-
