The Ministry of Public Health and its Partners have put in place various kits to take charge of all the cases and treatment of water points in the affected areas of the Region. These same kits have been made available in the neighbouring regions of Adamaoua and Far-North to anticipate any future case. Since the notification of the first case, a permanent team has been put in place, and is currently working on possible solutions to prevent this epidemic as soon as possible.

The Minister of Public Health expresses his compassion to the families affected and reassures that the government is going to treat affected cases free of charge. He calls on the general public and those of the Northern Region in particular to be vigilant with persons demonstrating symptoms of acute diarrhea with or without vomiting. People with such symptoms should be taken immediately to the closest Health District. He equally calls on each and everyone to take precautions and carryout basic hygienic practices such as:

- Washing of hands regularly with water and soap before and after meals, as well as after using the toilet;
- Avoiding the act of defecating in open air or in running water, by using latrines or toilets;
- Ensuring the portability of water before its consumption;
- Washing of food and consuming them well cooked and hot;
- Avoiding the manipulation of corpse.
